

Short CV Verena Schroeder

Verena Schroeder studied Pharmacy at the University of Basel and received the Swiss Federal Diploma as a Pharmacist in 1999. She worked as assistant pharmacist in public pharmacies in the canton of Lucerne. After her studies, Verena carried out her doctoral thesis on blood coagulation factor XIII (FXIII) at the University Hospital Bern. Then she continued her postdoctoral research on FXIII at the University of Bern, followed by a two-year postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Leeds, UK, where she started work on the complement system. In 2010, Verena returned to the University of Bern where she set up her own research group “Experimental Haemostasis” which investigates interactions between blood coagulation and the complement system and also continues her FXIII research. In 2016-2020, Verena served as Chairman of the Factor XIII and Fibrinogen Subcommittee of the International Society on Thrombosis and Haemostasis (ISTH). Verena’s research at the Department for BioMedical Research (DBMR), University of Bern, is funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation and other foundations. In 2013, Verena received her “Habilitation” from the Medical Faculty and in 2019 her Associate Professorship. Since 2016, Verena has been responsible for the reintroduction of the full Bachelor and Master courses in Pharmacy at the University of Bern. Since 2020, she is the Director of Studies for the Master in Pharmacy at the Medical Faculty, University of Bern.
